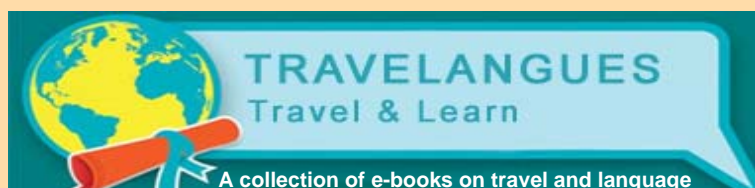

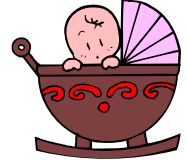
*Bonjour!* Hello! Can you find what *mon nom* is? To do that, you first have to listen to the alphabet! Listen here:

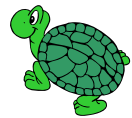
